The Zellerweg am schwarzen Herrgott is located at the beginning of the Zellertal Basin, which opens a few kilometers further east and concludes with the Frauenberg. Here as there, the pure limestone background prevails. The main difference is made by the microclimatic events. While the Frauenberg is characterized by the open, exposed location and wind evasions, the Zellerweg am schwarzen Herrgott is located on a steep narrow edge of the fracture, which once again protects the situation from rain and the full severity of light infall.

The Zellerweg am schwarzen Herrgott is one of the oldest and most famous vineyards in Germany (mentioned as a vineyard as early as the 8th century), but has been forgotten for decades. In the middle of the Zellerweg am schwarzen Herrgott runs the border between Rhine Hesse and the northern Palatinate. With the 2010 vintage, we revived this grandiose wine set with a wine that grows at the border.

Delicate and multi-layered-carried by a fine, juicy fruit sweetness, which is wonderfully captured by the barren soil and the stony aromas and does not make them appear superficial. The animating acidity gives this wine an enormous complexity and play.
